¹This is what the Lord God showed me: a basket of summer fruit. ² He said, "Amos, what do you see?" And I said, "A basket of summer fruit." Then the Lord said to me, "The end[a] has come upon my people Israel; I will spare them no longer.

⁴ Hear this, you who trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land, ⁵ saying, "When will the new moon be overso that we may sell grain, and the Sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale? I was sick and you took care of me. I was in prison and you visited me.' 37 Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food or thirsty and gave you something to drink? 38 And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you or naked and gave you clothing? 39 And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' 40 And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me.'

¹⁴ What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but does not have works? Surely that faith cannot save, can it? ¹⁵ If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? ¹⁷ So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. ¹⁸ But someone will say, "You have faith, and I have works." Show me your faith apart from works, and I by my works will show you faith.


